## Science Road Show Brings Hands-On Learning to Redoubt

We had an exciting opportunity to host the Science Roadshow on March 12th and 13th, serving as a trial venue for this interactive and educational experience. Over the course of two days, students were immersed in the wonders of science through live demonstrations and 60 hands-on exhibits.

The event commenced with an engaging live show on the water cycle, the carbon cycle, sources of fuel and the greenhouse effect. Students were captivated by the demonstrations, gaining a deeper understanding of how these scientific principles relate to everyday life.

The exhibition featured six themed sections, each with interactive displays designed to spark curiosity and encourage exploration. Each exhibit included a context board, explaining the science behind the

concept and its real-world applications. To enhance the learning experience, 12 Year 7 and 8 students took on the role of explainers, guiding their peers through the exhibits and sharing their knowledge.

The event concluded with a thrilling demonstration of balloons and Bernoulli's principle, leaving students amazed by the fascinating effects of air pressure and rocket launches with a BOOM!

These hands-on demonstrations and live shows helped deepen the students understanding of these important scientific principles, making learning both fun and engaging! Here are some key scientific concepts they learned.

- Pressure is the force applied over a given area.
- A vacuum is created when there are unbalanced pressures in a system.
- The faster a fluid (like air) moves, the lower its pressure a principle known as Bernoulli's Principle.

Gases, like air, can compress and expand, making them somewhat elastic in nature. The Science Roadshow was a perfect complement to Science Week at Redoubt North, reinforcing key scientific ideas in a fun and interactive way.
