

### JUNIOR SCHOOL SCIENCE EXPERIMENTS

The students in Discovery Pod were very excited to take part in hands-on science experiments in the classroom. One of their favourite activities involved exploring static electricity. They rubbed balloons on their hair, uniforms and a wool blanket to charge them up. Once charged, they placed the balloons on their heads and were amazed to see their hair stand on end. The children experimented further by holding the charged-up balloon in front of a soft drink aluminum can. To their delight, the can slowly rolled towards the balloon.

Another exciting experiment involved making spaghetti and grape dance in a bubbling mixture of baking soda and vinegar. The children watched closely, described their observations in detail and later wrote stories about their scientific experiences. These experiments sparked curiosity, encouraged careful observation and gave the children the chance to experience the joy of discovery through science.

A big thank you to our wonderful Year 6 Science Leaders, who prepared the materials, guided the groups and explained the science behind the experiments. Their support made the learning even more enjoyable and meaningful to the younger students.




### FOOTSTEPS AGILITY TRAINING
