TREAD LIGHTLY CARAVAN

For the last two weeks, the school has had the Tread Lightly Caravan visiting. The students in Year 1 and 2 took part in the Great Veggie Project as an activity

during their class session. Students planted their own radish seeds to take home as an activity to do with their family. They learnt about where to put different types of rubbish and where water goes when it goes down a storm drain.

The year 3 to 8 students used a computer touchscreen to answer simple questions about their lifestyles (e.g. what is in their lunch box, how they get to school).

The result was expressed as the number of "Earths" needed if everyone used the same amount of resources as the children are currently using.

Students also used a video microscope to get a closer look at nature. They looked at compost and other animal/plant specimens to gain an appreciation of the intricacy of nature and the importance of an ecosystem. The students saw the decomposition rate of different types of waste in a landfill and learnt why it is important to minimise the amount of waste created.

The response from the students was really positive and they are motivated to learn more!

Our Intermediate Boys and Girls Softball teams both finished 2nd in their pools at the South Eastern Zone Tournament, both just narrowly missing out on making the finals.

The Intermediate Girls Cricket Team have been playing a weekly cricket game every Wednesday afternoon. Last week we hosted Mission Heights Junior College on our new school cricket wicket. Our girls team won with 159 runs to 109, placing 3rd overall for the afterschool competition.
